The Peel Invitational is an elite archery event held in Lake Clifton, Western Australia. With its specialty targets and unique scoring system, the Peel Invitational will test the skills of even the most seasoned Archer.

Key Information-

- ❖ Prize Money and Prizes totaling Over \$5000.
- ❖ This event is open to all Archery Alliance Association members.
- ❖ This is a **Compound Only** Archery Tournament
- ❖ The Peel Shootout is a one of a kind Archery Event for WA with specialty targets and a unique scoring system.
- ❖ There will be three main rounds and a final **Top 5** Shootout for each division which will be shot in front of spectators on our special shootout course.
- ❖ All rounds are Single arrow only.
- ❖ The Peel Invitational will consist of Two (2) Classes Elite and Trophy
- ❖ There will be three (3) separate divisions
 - ❖ Open Division
 - ❖ Bowhunter
 - ❖ Junior (Trophy Class Only)
- ❖ All divisions are combined Male and Female



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Program-

Peel Invitational 2022 – May 7th and 8th

- ❖ Peel Invitational starts – May 7th at 11am
- ❖ Location: 685 Southern Estuary Rd, Lake Clifton WA 6215, Australia
- ❖ Nomination close Friday 22nd April 2022
- ❖ Marked Distance from 5.6 to 60m. Cub and Junior peg 50% +/- 10%. Range finders are permitted.

Day 1- Saturday May 7th

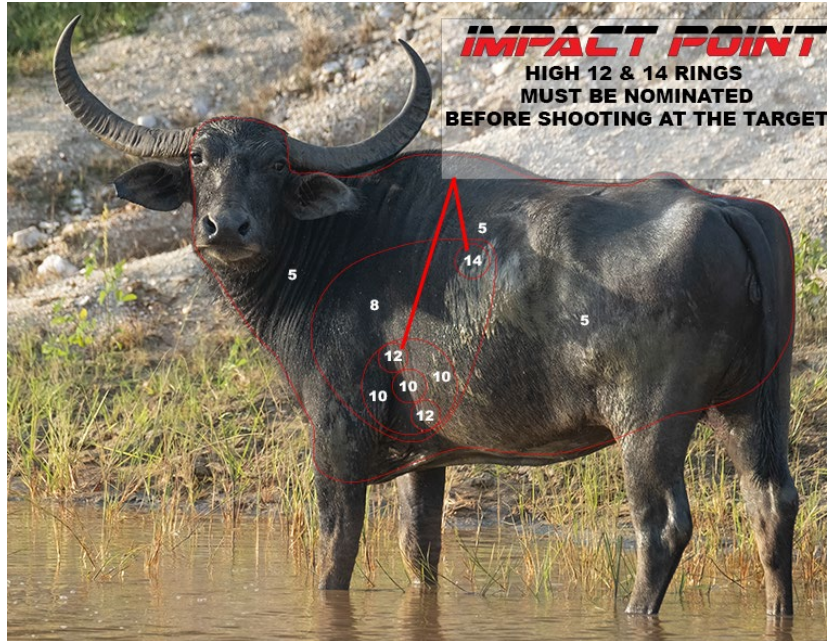
- ❖ Registration opens at 9am
- ❖ Bow Checks from 10am
- ❖ Muster at 10:45am
- ❖ Shoot Starts at 11am
- ❖ 1 Arrow Round Morning - Standard Scoring
- ❖ 1 Arrow Round Afternoon - Standard Scoring
- ❖ Scores totaled and posted

Day 2- Sunday May 8th

- ❖ Bow Checks from 9am
- ❖ Muster at 9:45am
- ❖ Shoot Starts at 10am
- ❖ 1 Arrow Round Morning - Standard Scoring
- ❖ Scores will be tallied for all rounds and the Top 5 scores announced from each shoot Each division
- ❖ Top 5 Shootout Final
 - ✚ 1 Arrow Round
 - ✚ Shot in separate area with seating for spectators near members practice range.



Targets and Scoring



For all Rounds-

- ❖ A shot timer of 2 minutes will apply
- ❖ Only one let down is permitted per target.
- ❖ Bonus rings will be tallied in the event of tie breakers
- ❖ Line must be broken by the arrow
- ❖ No arrows are to be removed until all arrow scores recorded

Round 1, 2 & 3 Score Zone

- 🚩 Hide Line- Zone 5
 - 🚩 Zone 8
 - 🚩 Zone 10- With Centre 10 Bonus Ring
 - 🚩 Lower Zone 12 Bonus Ring **“Not in play when Upper 12 is nominated”**
 - 🚩 Upper Zone 12 Bonus Ring **“Must Be Nominated”**
 - 🚩 Zone 14 Bonus Ring
- All bonus rings to be tallied**

Top 5 SHOOTOUT Score Zones

- 🚩 Hide Line- Zone 5
 - 🚩 Zone 8
 - 🚩 Zone 10- With Centre 10 Bonus Ring to be tallied
 - 🚩 Lower Zone 12 Bonus Ring **“Not in play when Upper 12 is nominated”**
 - 🚩 Upper Zone 12 Bonus Ring **“Must Be Nominated”**
 - 🚩 Zone 14 Bonus Ring
- All bonus rings to be tallied**



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Classes and Divisions-

Classes

- ❖ The Peel Shootout will consist of Two (2) Classes **Elite** and **Trophy**

Divisions

- ❖ There will be three (3) separate divisions
 - Open Division
 - Bowhunter Division
 - Junior Division (Trophy Class Only)
- ❖ All divisions are combined Male and Female

Elite Class- Prize Money

- ❖ Elite Open (Mens and Womens Adults 17 and over)
- ❖ Elite Bowhunter (Mens and Womens Adults 17 and over)

Trophy Class- Prizes and Trophies

- ❖ Trophy Open (Mens and Womens Adults 17 and over)
- ❖ Trophy Bowhunter (Mens and Womens Adults 17 and over)
- ❖ Trophy Junior (Youths 17 and under)

Entry Fees

- ❖ Registration Fee \$15.00 per archer
- ❖ Adult archer \$35.00 per archer
- ❖ Junior \$10.00 per archer (unless nominating in Open or Bowhunter Division)

Elite Prize Pools

- ❖ 1st Place 50%
- ❖ 2nd Place 35%
- ❖ 3rd Place 15%



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Rules

1. A competitor must be a current member of an Archery Alliance Association to qualify for the event.
 - ❖ Archery Alliance Associations are-
 - Australian Bowhunters Association- ABA
 - Archery Australia- AA
 - Traditional Archery Australia-TAA
 - 3D Archery Association of Australia- 3DAAA
2. Day 1 will consist of two 20 target rounds, 1 arrow round for each division
3. Day 2 will consist of- (for each division)
 - ❖ a 1x 20 target, 1 arrow round and,
 - ❖ The Top 5 **SHOOTOUT** which will consist of-
 - 1x 5 target, 1 arrow round and after the 5th target is shot and scores tallied,
 - If first place leads second place by more than 10 points they will be declared the winner.
 - any archer is within 10 points of the lead a 6 sixth target will be shot as the decider.
4. Competitors over the age of 17 may register for the event as an Elite Open, Elite Bowhunter, Trophy Open or Trophy Bowhunter.
5. Competitors who are 17 or under on Day 1 may register in the above divisions with signed consent of their parent/guardian, and pay the applicable division fee.
6. Competitors who are 17 or under on Day 1 are classed as Juniors.



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7. The event management committee of the event will be designated by Peel Archers Inc and 3 person protest committee will be nominated by Peel archers.
8. The ABA Rules of Shoot for National Archery Games will apply except where varied or overridden by this document, or as desired by the event management committee.
9. The competed divisions eligible for nomination of this event are:
10. Equipment Restrictions
 - ❖ Compound Bows only
 - ❖ Open - NONE
 - ❖ Bowhunter - Only 1 stabiliser is allowed on the bow not exceeding 400mm when fitted to the bow unless the bow is fitted with a Quivaliser in which case all arrows must be carried in the on the bow in the Quivaliser.
11. All competitors compete against each other within the division (male and female)
12. Range Finders permitted.
13. Aluminum and carbon arrows ARE allowed in all divisions.
14. All open division competitors will shoot from the red marker
15. Juniors will be made up of the same divisions.
16. Juniors shoot from the green marker
17. There must be a minimum of 5 competitors registered in a division (except for junior divisions) for that division to be competed.
18. 2 weeks prior to the event the Shoot Director will advise in writing which divisions are declared satisfied and will be competed.
19. Where a competitor has nominated for a division that is closed and will not be competed, the archer will be entitled to a full refund of all fees paid OR to nominate for another eligible division that is satisfied.
20. A competitor who has nominated for this event may withdraw their nomination up to 6 weeks prior to the event and have their fee(s) (excluding the administration fee component) refunded.
21. The event management committee may cap the number of total competitors and/or cap the number of competitors in each open division to ensure the fair participation and timely running of the event.
22. Competitors registered in each open division must use the same courses (in any order) each day.
23. A competitor will not be deemed to have nominated in any regard for this event until all fees are paid in full and acknowledged by the event Score Recorder.
24. Scoring
 - ❖ 2D rounds.
 - The ABA Rules of Shoot for National Archery Games will apply. Except where varied by this document or desired by the management committee for this event.
 - The Range Officer will not be bound by the distance and group restrictions when setting courses. Additional zones will be added to the targets.
25. Allocation of Points to Determine Place getters for Open Divisions:
 - ❖ The event will be made up of 3 rounds of archery plus a Top 5 **SHOOTOUT**.
 - ❖ At the completion of each days shooting the Score Recorder will tally the score and post where the competitor finished in their division for the day.
 - ❖ At the completion of 3 rounds the score will tallied in their division for a combined score.
 - ❖ The Top 5 scores of each division will go through to the 4th "Top 5 **SHOOTOUT**" round.
 - ❖ Where a competitor does not start a round, they will be allocated a score of zero.
 - ❖ Where a competitor does not finish a round, their recorded score will be used to their final total.



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- ❖ Where there is a tie bonus rings will be counted and used to determine place rankings.
 - ❖ Where more than 1 competitor has the same score with the same amount of bonus rings for the division, the competitors will at the first available opportunity at the direction of the event management committee conduct a golden arrow shoot off.
 - The event management committee will set a target at 40 meters.
 - All competitors will shoot 1 arrow, closest to 10 ring centre will continue.
 - If a tie still exists, all competitors will move back approximately 10 meters at the direction of the Shoot Director.
 - If a tie still exists, all competitors will shoot again with the closest to centre winning and repeated until a winner has been
 - declared by the shoot director.
26. The competitor with the highest points score in their nominated division after the Top 5 **SHOOTOUT** round will be declared the winner of that division. The total number of bonus rings shot by a competitor will be added up for the purpose of determining tied prize money positions, with the most bonus rings taking the superior position. Where a position is tied with points and bonus rings in an open division, the 14 bonus rings will be counted if still tied a golden arrow shoot off format will be used.
27. Prize Money Awarded
- ❖ The prize money pool for the individual open divisions will be made up of the entire designated portion of the nomination fee in that division as stipulated on the registration form.
 - ❖ The prize money will be distributed to the top 3 placegetters with the highest combined points score in each open division as follows:
 - 1st Place - 50 percent of the prize pool
 - 2nd Place - 35 percent of the prize pool
 - 3rd Place - 15 percent of the prize pool
28. Trophies and Awards will be made available to the top 3 placegetters for Trophy Open, Bowhunter Open and Trophy Junior divisions.
29. Protests:
- ❖ The protest committee will be made up of a panel to be nominated 1 week prior to the event.
 - ❖ A competitor within 1 hour of finishing their rounds on the day where their protest has occurred may lodge a protest with any member of the protest committee. The protest is to be in written format including the names of any witnesses and accompanied by a \$50 fee (for each separate protest)
 - ❖ The protest committee will make all such enquiries, in any format, as it deems necessary including where required calling on witnesses.
 - ❖ The protest committee will then decide on an outcome and inform the protesting competitor. Where the protest is up-held the \$50 fee will be reimbursed. Where the protest is dismissed the \$50 fee will be classed as an administrative fee for the event.
 - ❖ The protest committee can take any action(s) it decides is warranted.
 - ❖ The decision will be final, and no further discussion will be entered into.



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
